1. All articles for exhibit in this department must be placed **Saturday, August 20, 9 am - 3 pm.**
2. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the bona fide maker of the article.
3. **No article shall be permitted to be exhibited in the Domestic Dept. if it has been previously exhibited therein.**
4. Exhibitors may **enter only one (1) item per class.**
5. Ribbons will be awarded for 3 places when earned
6. Exhibitors must furnish hangers for garments. Failure to do so will **drop** article one (1) place.
7. In order to provide security for Domestic Arts, each exhibitor is asked to contribute a 2-hour block of time during fair week to host the building. Time preference may be mailed to Marjie McDougall or sign up when entries are brought in.

DOMESTIC ART

1. All exhibitors should be aware of the quality criteria for the art pieces of their entries.
2. Any identification of the maker that has been sewn on or inked or signed on the piece should be covered to insure anonymity during judging. This cover will be removed when judging is complete.

5. **Secure** to the bag (or fleece) **two cards** with the following: **A. your name and/or farm name B. breed of sheep**
6. Fleeces will be judged according to breed standard, suitability for hand spinning (crimp, luster, strength).
7. Exhibitors will be allowed to remain for judging if desired, but may not attempt to influence judging process in any manner.
8. Fleeces **will be rejected** for any of the following: heavy containment; fiber length less than two inches; excessive cutting or felting; moths; mold or any problem the superintendent deems unacceptable.

The size of the jar to be used is specified in each class. Products canned with preservatives will be disqualified. Products not sealed will be disqualified.

FOOD PRESERVATION

Sections 33 – 40 Entry Fee \$.50

STANDARDS FOR ALL CANNED PRODUCTS

COLOR: As nearly as possible that of the natural fruit or vegetable.

CLEARNESS: Syrup or liquid clear and free from seeds.

PACK: Arrangement with reference to symmetry and best use of space. Uniformity of shape and size. As large a proportion of solids to liquids as possible.

METHOD: Only safe standards of canning methods (USDA) approved are acceptable. Indicate canning method used.

CONTAINERS: Standard canning jars only.

FLAVOR: As nearly as possible like natural flavor. Canned fruits should not be too sweet.

TEXTURE: Tender but not overcooked. Uniformity-ripened products. No defective or over-ripened fruits or vegetables.

Only young and tender vegetables should be canned.

STANDARDS FOR JAMS AND JELLIES / BUTTERS

*NO PARAFFIN TO BE USED ON JAMS & JELLIES

TEXTURE OF JELLIES: Shape preserved when removed from mound; quivering; shapes retained when cut with spoon.

TEXTURE OF JAMS: Clear and thick but not too soft a jelly.

FLAVOR: Natural fruit flavor preserved; not too much or too little sugar.
