### Rules and Regulations:

1. All articles for exhibit in this department must be placed **Saturday, August 22, 2009, 9 am - 3 pm**. No exhibits may be removed until **7:00 am, Monday, August 31, 2009**. All exhibits must be removed by **6:00 pm, Monday, August 31, 2009**.
2. Fair Association is not responsible for goods left after **6:00 pm, Monday, August 31, 2009**.
3. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the bona fide maker of the article.
4. **No article shall be permitted to be exhibited in the Domestic Dept. if it has been previously exhibited therein.**
5. Exhibitors may **enter only one (1) item per class**.
6. Ribbons will be awarded for 3 places when earned
7. Exhibitors must furnish hangers for garments. Failure to do so will **drop** article one (1) place.
8. In order to provide security for Domestic Arts, each exhibitor is asked to contribute a 2-hour block of time during fair week to host the building. Time preference may be mailed to Marjie McDougall or sign up when entries are brought in.

### **DOMESTIC ART**

1. All exhibitors should be aware of the quality criteria for the art pieces of their entries.
2. Any identification of the maker that has been sewn on or inked or signed on the piece should be covered to insure anonymity during judging. This cover will be removed when judging is complete.

### **NEEDLEWORK and TEXTILE ART**

#### General Appearance:

1. Careful construction, presentation, clean, well pressed, neatly folded or hung. Suitability to intended use.
2. Material: appropriate in quality, design and color.
3. Thread: appropriate quality, size and color.
4. Workmanship: Stitches and edges smooth and even. Stitches of appropriate length.
5. Finishing: Back of article neat, corners well made, and ends of thread properly held in place.

#### **SECTION 6 – HANDSPUN SKEINS**

All skeins must be handspun by exhibitor. A **minimum** of 2 oz. and/or 80 yards (unless otherwise stated) & neatly wound, tied in at least 4 places with matching yarn, washed to set twist. Exhibitors to include information of source of fiber(s), sheep breed & dye source. Drop spindle skeins minimum: 1 oz. and/or 40 yards. Skeins from commercially prepared fiber may be entered only in Classes 6, 7, 12, & 13. For Classes 1 - 5, you must include breed of sheep.

All Baked Goods must be exhibited in cellophane or transparent bags. All Preserved Food must be exhibited in Glass Jars and must have been canned within a year. The size of the jar to be used is specified in each class. Products canned with preservatives will be disqualified. Products not sealed will be disqualified.

**\*\* If directions are not followed, entry will be dropped one placing. For example, if recipe is not included.**

## **STANDARDS FOR ALL CANNED PRODUCTS**

**COLOR:** As nearly as possible that of the natural fruit or vegetable.

**CLEARNESS:** Syrup or liquid clear and free from seeds.

**PACK:** Arrangement with reference to symmetry and best use of space. Uniformity of shape and size. As large a proportion of solids to liquids as possible.

**METHOD:** Only safe standards of canning methods (USDA) approved are acceptable. Indicate canning method used.

**CONTAINERS:** Standard canning jars only.

**FLAVOR:** As nearly as possible like natural flavor. Canned fruits should not be too sweet.

**TEXTURE:** Tender but not overcooked. Uniformity-ripened products. No defective or over-ripened fruits or vegetables. Only young and tender vegetables should be canned.

## **STANDARDS FOR JAMS AND JELLIES / BUTTERS**

\*NO PARAFFIN TO BE USED ON JAMS & JELLIES

**TEXTURE OF JELLIES:** Shape preserved when removed from mound; quivering; shapes retained when cut with spoon.
